I just returned from the 6day Lower Main Salmon trip from the Hammer Creek to the Heller Bar on the Snake River. Before the trip, I had heard of its beautiful sandy beach

The hardest Snow Hole rapid was, even at the 4500 cfs, pretty exciting with big waves and holes. One of our rafts was pinned on two rocks in the middle of the China rapid. With a help from a good Samaritan passing by on another group's raft, the raft and everyone on it safely escaped.


New Location! Shoreline Unitarian Church


board member. A secret committee of highly discrete judges then select from your nomi-
